We invite you to visit our PHOTO STU-DIO OPEN HOUSE on Friday, May 8th at 1:00pm. Having our own Photo Studio, especially in our clubhouse, is great for spontaneous work and also because we can leave the majority of equipment setup on location. After a short training and safety orientation you need to reserve your day, time, (two hour increments) bring your subject, camera, and start shooting, Our studio replaces the storage area and measures 20 ft. long x 8 ft. high and 8 ft. wide. A great space for small to medium size photography, please no automobiles or elephants. We have made a decision for providing the room, table, lights, light stands, a background, and several tripods. A few classes will be forth coming on lighting and studio techniques. Don't think for a minute that this is the complete and full list of equipment - it's the basics. 
